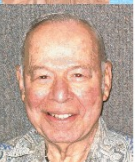

Article 4: Sunshine Performance Club To Present FREE Musical Variety Show To Benefit Saddleback Foundation

On Saturday, February 16th, 2008, at 7 pm in Clubhouse 3 auditorium, the Sunshine Performance Club will present a musical variety show as a benefit for Saddleback Memorial Foundation.

Sam Rose, in Sinatra style, will sing several songs in the show, including, "I've Never Been In Love Before" and "I've Got The World On A String." When Sam was a boy, he sold magazines in bars, restaurants, and door-to-door. To bolster his courage as he came home late at night, Sam would walk down the middle of the street singing "The Boulevard Of Broken Dreams." For years, he avidly listened to "Your Hit Parade," and while stationed abroad during WW II, he sang with a small band. After 50 years in the printing field, Sam now sings with Emeritus classes, "Sunshine" performances and has appeared in "Old Pros" and "Theatre Guild" productions.

David Hartman, master of ceremonies for the show, will sing several songs including, "Somewhere" and "The Impossible Dream." A retired New York attorney, David served there as a Special Assistant Attorney General. In WW II, David saw action in the Battle of the Bulge, winning the Bronze Star for valor. After the war, he acted and sang in several New York Off-Broadway shows. Last August, he was a "Villagers Got Talent" winner and is a 2-year member of the "Sunshine" group. If he's not singing, you'll find him at the golf course or billiards room; or you might hear him singing as he drives his golf cart to and from the golf course.

Ed Hayes will sing several songs in the show. In addition to his work outside Laguna Woods Village, (such as "Scrooge" in Dana Point Theater in 2005), Ed has been featured as an actor in most of the "Theater Guild" productions since moving here six years ago. He's currently rehearsing for the "Old Pros" coming production, "Death Of A Salesman." Ed also sings, using his repertoire of 100 voice

impersonations, many of which were demonstrated during the "Villagers Got Talent" show last August where he took 1st place. He is a favorite when the "Sunshine" group makes "sunshine" by performing at nursing homes and hospitals.
